

# How to cite data from ENSDF

If data are used from 10 or fewer nuclides and the evaluation has been published in Nuclear Data Sheets, it is recommended that the citation is to the publication of the mass chain evaluation. This information can be found at the top of the ENSDF file.

Example:

## Adopted Levels, Gammas

<u>Type</u>	<u>Author</u>	<u>History Citation</u>	<u>Literature Cutoff Date</u>
Full Evaluation	M. J. Martin	NDS 114, 1497 (2013)	31-Aug-2013

Citation should read: **M.J. Martin, Nucl. Data Sheets 114, 1497 (2013).**

If data are used from more than 10 nuclides or if the evaluation was published solely in the ENSDF database, it is recommended to cite the ENSDF database itself. An example of the latter case is:

## Adopted Levels, Gammas

<u>Type</u>	<u>Author</u>	<u>History Citation</u>	<u>Literature Cutoff Date</u>
Full Evaluation	Balraj Singh	ENSDF	28-Feb-2018

Citation should read: **“From ENSDF database as of Month day, Year. Version available at <http://www.nndc.bnl.gov/ensarchivals/>”**

The date should correspond to the date on which the ENSDF database was consulted.
