Lawyers in Delaware are bound by the Delaware Lawyers' Rules of Professional Conduct. The Office of Disciplinary Counsel screens, evaluates, and investigates disciplinary complaints which allege a violation of the rules. If warranted, the office may seek to initiate formal disciplinary proceedings. Disciplinary complaints and proceedings are confidential in accordance with the Delaware Lawyers' Rules of Disciplinary Procedure.

The office also investigates claims of the unauthorized practice of law in Delaware according to the Rules of the Unauthorized Practice of Law Subcommittee of the Board on Professional Responsibility.
