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Foreword

TACS'91 is the first International Conference on Theoretical Aspects of Computer Software held at Tohoku University, Sendai, Japan, September 24–27, 1991. This volume contains thirty-seven papers and an abstract for talks presented at the conference.

TACS'91 focused on theoretical foundations of programming, and theoretical aspects of the design, analysis and implementation of programming languages and systems. The following topics were mentioned in the call for papers:

- Logic, proof, specification and semantics of programs and languages
- Theories and models of concurrent, parallel and distributed computation
- Constructive logic, category theory, and type theory in computer science
- Theory-based systems for specifying, synthesizing, transforming, testing, and verifying software
