

Modern Orthodox theology is the living theological tradition of Eastern Christianity in continuity from the early church to the present. This book considers the full range of modern Orthodox thought, surveyed and analyzed chronologically, geographically and thematically. The first part of the book charts the development of modern Orthodox theology from the fall of Constantinople in 1453 until the early twenty-first century, with emphasis on significant theological movements and key personalities, considered in their chronological and geographic contexts. The second part of the book contains eight studies of major themes which have dominated Orthodox theology in modern times. The book includes an extensive Selected Bibliography arranged by chapter, Recommended Readings, and a detailed Index.
