Origen and the Holy Spirit is a fresh and in-depth examination of the pneumatology of the third-century theologian. Specifically, this study spotlights Origen of Alexandria's understanding of the person and work of the Holy Spirit in the context of the divine economy of salvation, both in the downward action of the distribution of the divine gifts and graces, and in the upward action of revelation and sanctification by which the Spirit leads the saints to the Son and the Father. By focusing on what the Holy Spirit actually does according to Origen, as well as who the Holy Spirit is in relation to the Son and Father, this study contributes necessary perspective to ongoing debates about the concept of Trinity in Origen's thought and demonstrates the importance of pneumatology to Origen's broader theological vision.
